1. The District ran a total of 19 calls for the month of April 2020

2. Projects currently working on;
- ISO rating – Continue to work on this project
  - District Policy, Procedure and SOG Manual – This is an ongoing project
  - Video Surveillance – Is now 100% completed.
  - Key Fob – This upgrade project has been completed.
3. Grants
- AFG – SCBA’s – Ordered. – Update – Scott has found a problem with the new masks and are working to correct it and have them certified by NFPA by June 2020.
  - Safer Act – FEMA GO is now up and running where we can submit for payments. Submitted the first request for just under \$28,000.
  - Homeland Security Grant has been submitted for 7 new Mobile Radio’s.
  - Submitted a joint grant with YFPD for 2 vests to the Siletz Tribal Grant – Yamhill PD was awarded this grant last week.
  - I submitted an AFG-S grant on May 8, 2020 for just over \$2700 for supplies used for the COVID-19 event. We should find out in June if we will receive anything. This would be to help fund the restocking of the MCI Trailer.
4. The volunteers have done very well during this COVID-19 event. We were the last one in the county to go back to holding in person drills, so the first one was Thursday May 8<sup>th</sup>. Everyone did good at doing the on line training during the peak, but as with everyone we are at a point that we must get back to drills so that everyone is ready for what every may come this way this summer. We continue the social distancing and the using of PPE on all medical calls.
5. Last week we completed pump testing except for the water tender which we should have done in the next week or so. Everything passed.
6. The big issue that we have been dealing with is the new SCBA’s, RIT paks, and Fill Station that we had ordered in December of 2020. We found out a couple of weeks

ago that they had never been ordered and now the Scott company is no longer building Fill Stations or Air Compressors. As I gave the board earlier this week the details and were, we are at today. The key decision that the board needs to make is on the compressor.

7. The new engines are in Indiana getting the four-door conversation done. The 1<sup>st</sup> engine is already started and the 2<sup>nd</sup> one arrived there this week. They are still on time for completion with the first to be ready August 3 and the 2<sup>nd</sup> the end of August.
