June 10, 2019

1. The District ran a total of 42 calls for the month of May 2019

2. Projects currently working on;
- a. Brush-41 – **Have the vehicle, just working to get it put together.**
  - b. ISO rating – **Continue to work on this project**
  - c. District Policy, Procedure and SOG Manual – **This is an ongoing project**
  - d. Video Surveillance – **About 50% completed**
3. Grants
- a. AFG – SCBA’s – **Been submitted**
  - b. Homeland Security – **Was not awarded four spots from the money**
  - c. Safer Act – **Been submitted – 4-year Recruit and Retention Person**
  - d. Fire House Sub’s – Vests
  - e. VFA Grant – Pagers & Radio’s
4. The new Tender is here, and we are working at getting in officially in-service. Currently have 3 people working and getting signed off to run it with more to follow. The total cost to the district was \$7,115 for the Tender and \$1,516.87 to get it here. It was 2,319 miles, 290.2476 gallons of fuel. The district saved about \$1,300 by using the points from the District credit card.
5. Working with the auditor to get things ready for the audit. They will be here in August to do the onsite work.
6. Been working with vendors on Air Packs and specs for the new Engine. The Air Packs I’m working with MES to piggy-back on the Portland Fire contract and take a savings on the packs. On the engine I have been using the following specs; 1,500-gallon tank, Deck gun, Kenworth T-370 4 door cab, Foam, Generator, Light Tower, 1,750 gpm Darley pump, roll out tray for extrication equipment with hose reels for extrication tools and electrical power, Ladders and Suction in the Tank, Pump and Roll ability, 4 SCBA seats, and roll up doors. I have also asked them to include hose and appliances to see if it is cheaper for them or the District to get these items.
7. I have talked with Tammy at Umpqua Bank and they will be willing to work with the district in whatever we would need.

8. The May 18, 2019 EMS week BBQ and Concert went well, it would have been nice to have more people in attendance for the BBQ and concert.
